Acts 2:1-11

RESPONSORIAL PSALM

1 Corinthians 12:3-7, 12-13



GOSPEL

John 20:19-23

REFLECTION

All of us at our baptism have received the Holy Spirit and are called to take up the mission of Jesus. Accepting and taking up the mission of Jesus does not mean that we will not experience fear, anxiety, tension, uncertainty etc... Jesus gives us his Holy Spirit, who gives us His peace and helps us to stay committed to the mission of Jesus. In my daily living, am I ready to choose Life and peace, love and forgiveness as I remain faithful to Jesus' saving mission? (Pause)

Some times we may only look for the Presence of the Spirit through 'extra ordinary manifestations' (first reading). The second reading of today reminds us that the Spirit is also manifested in 'forms of service' expressed in our daily living. The gospel invites us to offer Christ's love, peace and forgiveness to others. In these difficult times, keeping social distancing and abiding by government norms, we have several opportunities of service available to us. The Spirit is also manifested when we are ready to die to ourselves. (**Pause**)



In Psalm 103 we pray that 'the glory of the Lord last forever; may the Lord rejoice in his works'. Jesus has sent us and has breathed the Holy Spirit upon us, which empowers us to continue his mission. Like the psalmist, let us pray and ask God to send his Spirit upon us, so that, the renewal of the earth continues in and through us. (**Pause**)

PRAYER OF THE FAITHFUL

Leader: On the Solemnity of Pentecost, let us confidently bring our prayers before the Lord.

Our response is: Lord, hear our prayer.

We pray for all the members of the Church, that we may use wisely and well all the diverse gifts of the Holy Spirit; (**pause**) let us pray to the Lord...

We pray for our planet earth that God may pour out his Spirit and bring renewal in all our political, civic, educational and religious institutions; (**pause**) let us pray to the Lord...

We pray for all those who are suffering because of the pandemic of Corona virus. May they be open to the healing touch of the Holy Spirit; (**pause**) let us pray to the Lord...



We pray for all baptised Christians that we may be faithful to the mission of Jesus; (**pause**) let us pray to the Lord...

Leader: Heavenly Father, you sent your Spirit to dwell in us. Hear the prayers that we offer you and that one day we may enjoy everlasting life and peace with you. We ask this through Christ our Lord, Amen.

Let us together at the Saviour's command and formed by Divine teaching, dare to say: (All say the Lord's Prayer together) Our Father, ...
